SUTAB PREPARATION FOR COLONOSCOPY

Your prep instructions differ from those included on the box, <u>do not</u> follow instruction on the box. Please follow these instructions carefully! Important: Please do not eat breakfast the day prior to your procedure!

PURCHASE AT THE PHARMACY:

Sutab Bowel Preparation (prescription)
4-tablets Zofran (prescription for nausea)

FIVE DAYS PRIOR TO YOUR PROCEDURE:

- All aspirin and anti-inflammatory medications including ibuprofen, Motrin, Aleve, naproxen, Naprosyn, sulindac, piroxicam, Feldene, indomethacin, diclofenac, and Voltaren are to be continued. Tylenol (acetaminophen) is also safe to continue.
- If you are taking anticoagulants or blood thinners (Lovenox, Heparin, Coumadin/warfarin, Eliquis/apixaban,
 Pradaxa/dabigatran, Xarelto/rivaroxaban, Plavix/clopidogrel) we REQUIRE an office visit prior to your procedure to discuss
 use of these medications. Instructions regarding interrupting these medications will be provided at your office visit. Please
 reach out to us if you have not had an office visit to discuss anticoagulation.
- Stop all fiber supplements including Metamucil, Citrucel, Benefiber, FiberChoice and flax seeds.
- If you are diabetic and use insulin, please contact our office for insulin instructions.
- PLEASE call our office if you have any questions about which medications you should or should not take.
- 3 days prior to your exam, avoid nuts and seeds.

ONE DAY PRIOR TO YOUR EXAM:

- Do not eat any solid food this is different from the instructions on the SuTab box please follow our instructions.
- Take only clear liquids by mouth. This includes clear juices (apple, grape, strained orange, strained lemonade), tea, coffee (no milk or creamer), soft drinks, sports drinks (Gatorade, Powerade), clear broth or bouillon, Jell-O and Popsicles.
- Avoid red drinks, red Jell-O and dairy products.
- Consume large amounts of clear fluids to increase success of the bowel flush and help avoid hunger.
- Take 1 tablet of Zofran to help prevent nausea 30 45 minutes prior to starting your prep. May repeat x 1 as needed.
- At 5:00 pm open 1 SUTAB bottle of 12 tablets. Fill provided cup with water to 16oz line. Swallow 1 tablet with water every 1-2 minutes. You should finish the 12 tablets and the entire 16 oz of water within 20 minutes. Wait 1 hour.
- After 1 hour, fill the provided cup to 16oz line and drink over 30 minutes.
- 30 minutes after completing the 2nd cup, fill the provided cup to 16oz and drink the entire 3rd cup over 30 minutes. This will induce stools. **You must finish the dose and three 16-ounce cups of water within 2 hours of starting**.
- If you feel nauseous at any time while taking your prep try to drink more slowly, using a straw can help. If vomiting occurs, take an additional tablet of Zofran or call one of our numbers below for instructions.

- You may continue consuming clear liquids before and after the above medications.

THE DAY OF THE PROCEDURE:

- Take 1 tablet of Zofran to help prevent nausea 30 45 minutes prior to starting your prep. May repeat x 1 as needed.
- Start the second bottle of SUTAB starting 7 hours before your exam's scheduled time (eg: if your appointment is at 10 am, you should start at 3 am. If it is at 1 pm, you should start at 6 am). Fill provided cup with water to 16oz line. Swallow 1 tablet with a sip of water every 1-2 minutes. You should finish the 12 tablets and the entire 16 oz of water within 20 minutes. Wait 1 hour.
- After 1 hour, fill the provided cup to 16oz line and drink the 2nd cup over 30 minutes.
- 30 minutes after completing the 2nd cup, fill the provided cup to 16oz and drink the entire 3rd cup over 30 minutes. This will induce stools. You must finish the second bottle and three 16-ounce cups of water within 2 hours of starting, so that your stomach is empty for your exam.
- You may continue to drink clear liquids until 4 hours prior to your procedure.

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- After completing the bowel preparation, your stools should be watery and see through. Please contact our endoscopy department if your stools are not watery or you are concerned with the results of the preparation.
- DO NOT take anything by mouth for 4 hours prior to your procedure except medications this is very important.

 Drinking less than 4 hours before your procedure may result in delay or cancellation of your procedure!
- Take your usual prescribed medications with small sips of water. If you are on anti-inflammatory medications or blood thinners please see instructions above.
- Please bring a list of your current medications and correct dosage to your appointment.
- **NO DRIVING** Because of the sedatives that you will be given **you cannot drive for the remainder of the day.** You need to have a driver of your choice to take you home after your procedure. If your driver wishes to discuss results of your procedure with the doctor, please have them accompany you to your procedure and **remain on site**.
- You will be sedated for your procedure. Please plan to avoid making important decisions for the remainder of the day after your procedure.
